- Of the 20 counties with the greatest percentage of Chamorro speakers, six are in California and four in Washington. In all, 18 of the top 20 counties are west of the Mississippi.
- Chamorro is the 24th most common language spoken in Hawaii and the 35th most common language spoken in Washington State.
- Chamorro is the sixth most common language spoken at home in Boone County, Ark., and the eighth most common language in Bell County, Texas and Kitsap County, Wash.
- In the United States, 1 of every 16,445 people age five and older speaks Chamorro at home. In Hawaii, this figure is 1 in 1,391 people, while in Washington State, 1 in 2,450 residents is a Chamorro speaker.
- Within the counties, Kitsap County, Wash. has the greatest rate of Chamorro speakers (1 in every 445 residents), followed by Solano County, Calif. (1 in every 475 residents) and Thurston County, Wash. (1 in every 518 residents).
