Notes

- Of the 20 counties with the greatest percentage of Dakota speakers, 15 are located in South Dakota, including the top nine.
- Shannon County, S.D. is home to 13.1 percent of the nation's Dakota speakers.
- Dakota is the third most common language spoken in South Dakota and the sixth most common language spoken in North Dakota.
- Dakota is the second most common language spoken at home in 19 counties in four states: South Dakota (15 counties), North Dakota (2), Montana (1), and Nebraska (1).
- In the United States, 1 of every 12,811 people age five and older speaks Dakota at home. In South Dakota, this figure is 1 in 66 people, while in North Dakota, 1 in 476 residents is a Dakota speaker.
- Within the counties, Shannon County, S.D. has the greatest rate of Dakota speakers (1 in every 4.1 residents), followed by Todd County, S.D. (1 in every 4.8 residents) and Ziebach County, S.D. (1 in every 5.2 residents).
