Notes

- Of the 20 counties with the highest percentage of Danish speakers, four are located in Iowa and three in Montana.
- Los Angeles County, Calif. has more than double the number of Danish speakers of any other county in the nation.
- Danish is the 24th most common language spoken in Iowa and the 26th most common language spoken in South Dakota, Utah, and (tied) Wyoming.
- Danish is the second most common language spoken at home in Audubon County, Iowa, and the third most common language in Cass County, Iowa, Shelby County, Iowa, and Sheridan County, Mont.
- In the United States, 1 of every 7,857 people age five and older speaks Danish at home. In Utah, this figure is 1 in 2,065 people, while in Washington State, 1 in 3,134 residents is a Danish speaker.
- Within the counties, Audubon County, Iowa has the greatest rate of Danish speakers (1 in every 72 residents), followed by Sheridan County, Mont. (1 in every 111 residents) and Shelby County, Iowa (1 in every 177 residents).
