- Danish is the 24th most common language spoken in Iowa and the 26th most common language spoken in South Dakota, Utah, and (tied) Wyoming.
- Danish is the second most common language spoken at home in Audobon County, Iowa, and the third most common language in Cass County, Iowa, Shelby County, Iowa, and Sheridan County, Mont.
- In the United States, 1 of every 7,857 people age five and older speaks Danish at home. In Utah, this figure is 1 in 2,065 people, while in Washington State, 1 in 3,134 residents is a Danish speaker.
- Within the counties, Audobon County, Iowa has the greatest rate of Danish speakers (1 in every 72 residents), followed by Sheridan County, Mont. (1 in every 111 residents) and Shelby County, Iowa (1 in every 177 residents).
