## Notes

- Of the 15 counties where Frisian speakers were found, California and Michigan are home to three apiece. Washington State and Wisconsin each feature two counties.
- Frisian is the 52nd (tied) most common language spoken in Vermont and the 90th (tied) most common language spoken in Michigan.
- Frisian is the fifth most common language spoken at home in Hopkins County, Texas, and the sixth most common language in Addison County, Vt.
- In the United States, 1 of every 285,190 people age five and older speaks Frisian at home. In Vermont, this figure is 1 in 19,150 people, while in Washington State, 1 in 42,313 residents is a Frisian speaker.
- Within the counties, Addison County, Vt. has the greatest rate of Frisian speakers (1 in every 1,119 residents), followed by Hopkins County, Texas (1 in every 1,190 residents) and Whatcom County, Wash. (1 in every 1,951 residents).
