Notes

- Of the 20 counties with the greatest percentage of Greek speakers, four are located in Massachusetts, with two each in Connecticut, Florida, Illinois, New York and Ohio.
- The five counties that compose New York City, plus the two counties that compose New York's Long Island account for 20.5 percent of the nation's Greek speakers.
- Greek is the fifth most common language spoken in New Hampshire and the ninth most common language spoken in Connecticut and Illinois.
- Greek is the third most common language spoken at home in Moffat County, Colo. and the fourth most common language in seven counties spread across seven states
- In the United States, 1 of every 718 people age five and older speaks Greek at home. In New York, this figure is 1 in 205 people, while in Massachusetts, 1 in 207 residents is a Greek speaker.
- Within the counties, Queens County, N.Y. has the greatest rate of Greek speakers (1 in every 53 residents), followed by Hancock County, W.Va. (1 in every 98 residents) and Bergen County, N.J. (1 in every 113 residents).
