- Lithuanian is the 22nd most common language spoken in Illinois and the 26th most common language spoken in Maine.
- Lithuanian is the third most common language spoken at home in Washington County, Fla. and the fourth most common language in Grand County, Colo.
- In the United States, 1 of every 6,851 people age five and older speaks Lithuanian at home. In Illinois, this figure is 1 in 1,059 people, while in Connecticut, 1 in 1,588 residents is a Lithuanian speaker.
- Within the counties, Grand County, Colo. has the greatest rate of Lithuanian speakers (1 in every 194 residents), followed by Washington County, Fla. (1 in every 215 residents) and Schuylkill County, Pa. (1 in every 454 residents).
