- Of the 15 counties where speakers of Mongolian were recorded, California, Colorado, New Jersey and Utah each boast two.
- Arlington County, Va. has more than double the percentage of Mongolian speakers than any other county in the United States.
- Mongolian is the 48th most common language spoken in Utah and the 50th (tie) most common language spoken in Arkansas.
- In the United States, 1 of every 101,893 people age five and older speaks Mongolian at home. In Utah, this figure is 1 in 9,634 people, while in Colorado, 1 in 12,921 residents is a Mongolian speaker.
- Within the counties, Arlington, Va. has the greatest rate of Mongolian speakers (1 in every 915 residents), followed by Utah County, Utah (1 in every 1,872 residents) and Denver County, Colo. (1 in every 3,691 residents).
