## Notes

- Of the 20 counties with the greatest percentage of Polish speakers, New Jersey and New York were home to three apiece.
- Cook County, Ill. has nearly five times the Polish speaking population of any other county in the nation, and accounts for 23.4 percent of the Polish speaking population of the nation.
- Polish is the third most common language spoken in Illinois and the fourth most common language spoken in New Jersey.
- Polish is the second most common language spoken at home in Otsego County, Mich., Presque Isle County, Mich., and Sherman County, Neb.
- In the United States, 1 of every 393 people age five and older speaks Polish at home. In Illinois, this figure is 1 in 62 people, while in Connecticut, 1 in 83 residents is a Polish speaker.
- Within the counties, Presque Isle County, Mich. has the greatest rate of Polish speakers (1 in every 31.7 residents), followed by Cook County, Ill. (1 in every 31.9 residents) and Karnes County, Texas ( 1 in every 35 residents).
