- Spanish is the only language other than English to be spoken by more than 63 percent of the population in any county in the United States.
- The percentage of Spanish speakers in Webb County, Texas (91.5 percent) is greater than the percentage of English speakers in 750 counties.
- Spanish is the second most common language spoken in 43 states and the District of Columbia.
- Spanish is the most common language spoken at home in 35 counties. Nearly three-quarters of these counties are located in Texas, with others in Arizona, California, Colorado, Florida and New Mexico.
- In the United States, 1 of every 9.3 people age five and older speaks Spanish at home. In New Mexico, this figure is 1 in 3.5 people, while in Texas, 1 in 3.7 residents is a Spanish speaker.
- Within the counties, Webb County, Texas has the greatest rate of Spanish speakers (91.4 in every 100 residents), followed by Maverick County, Texas (91.0 in every 100 residents) and Starr County, Texas (90.5 in every 100 residents).
