Languages in Alaska

- Anchorage Municipality's 55 languages tied for the 130th highest number recorded in any county in the United States. Other Alaska counties that were highly ranked included: Kenai Peninsula Borough (t-368) and the Fairbanks North Star Borough (t-388)
- Alaska has the highest percentage of speakers of Eskimo, Kuchin, Miao-Yao/Mien, Scottic Gaelic, Sebuano and Yupik in the United States. The Last Frontier also ranks second in the percentage of Ilocano, Laotian and Samoan speakers and third in the percentage of Korean and Thai speakers.
- The Aleutians East Census Borough has the highest percentage of Tagalog speakers of any county in the nation. Other counties that rank highly in a given language include: Aleutians West Census Area (second, Tagalog), Kodiak Island Borough (third, Tagalog) and Kenai Peninsula Borough (fourth, Russian).
