Languages in Hawaii

- Honolulu County's 82 languages tied for the 31st highest number recorded in any county in the United States. Other Hawaii counties that were highly ranked included: Hawaii County (t-236) and Maui County (t-252).
- Hawaii has the highest percentage of speakers of Bisayan, Chamorro, Chinese, Fijian, Hawaiian, Ilocano, Japanese, Korean, Malay, Micronesian, Marshallese, Palau, Pampangan, Ponapean, Samoan, Tagalog, Tongan and Trukese in the United States. The Aloha State also ranks second in the percentage of Cantonese, Indonesian, Mandarin, Sebuano, Thai and Vietnamese speakers.
- Honolulu County has the highest percentage of Bisayan, Japanese and Samoan speakers of any county in the nation. Other counties that rank highly in a given language include: Maui County (first, Ilocano) and Maui County (first, Tongan).
